- 4. The following should be provided in the application packet consisting of eight pages or less:
 - Cover page
 - Two letters of support from peers
 - Description showcasing interprofessional practice provided for the past 2 years
 - Previous award recognition for interprofessional practice
 - Evidence for developing and advocating for innovative interprofessional practice based on the following selection criteria.

Selection Criteria:

- Letters of support highlight exemplary interprofessional collaboration and practice.
- Evidence for developing excellent interprofessional practice in the clinical environment
- Demonstrates the impact of interprofessional practice on quality of patient care and/ or the community.
- Models IPEC competencies:
 - Competency 1 Values/Ethics
 - Competency 2 Roles/Responsibilities
 - IPEC Competency 3 Interprofessional Communication
 - IPEC Competency 4 Teams and Teamwork

- Shares a vision and passion for collaborative practice and enlists others to the team through a demonstration of mutual respect, trust building and empowerment of team members.
- Evidence of continuous quality improvement in enhancing the practice environment.
